4 PENNA. STEEL CO. MEN KILLED AND 4 HURT WHEN BRIDGE FALLS

Victims All From This Locality

Rightful Accident at Williamsport, Md., Caused By Collapsing Span

RASH CAME WITH NO WARNING

Five Workmen Left Uninjured on Brink Had Narrow Escape

Harrisburg, Md., Dec. 16.—Four men were killed and four others severely injured at 5 o'clock this morning by an accident occurring at the Williamsport bridge over the Potomac river at Williamsport.

The dead are: Ross H. Hibel, Danbury, Pa., aged 37; James C. Mears, Bendersville, Pa., 25; George M. Hanes, York, aged 35; Charles G. Duncanson, Pa., 26.

The injured: Charles Moore, Steelton, Pa., jaw broken and skull about level; Jerome D. Bollenbach, Hilltop, Pa., skull broken and eye injured; Frank L. Fleming, Buffalo Mills, Pa., hurt on head and body.

A steel girder was being placed on a derrick when the bridge collapsed. The injured were given temporary medical attention and later brought to Harrisburg on a freight car to the hospital.

How Hibel, one of the dead, is a brother of W. H. Hibel, of Bloomsburg, Pa., in the employ of the Pennsylvania State Police.

Five workmen were left standing on top of the bridge when it collapsed. The bodies will be shipped to the homes tomorrow.

Thomas Earle, superintendent of bridge and construction department of the Pennsylvania Steel Company, is in charge of the work.

The injured men will be brought home as soon as their condition will permit.

Venezuelan Capital Scene of Violent Outbreak Against President

HOUSES OF HIS FRIENDS WRECKED

His Rule of Tyranny Ended; Gomez Also Subject of Attack

Caracas, Venezuela, Monday, Dec. 14.—The people of Caracas today burned pictures of President Castro. An infuriated mob, uncontrolled by the police, swept through the city, burning the property of his household and his friends. The people roamed on all the streets and pictures of President Castro from the clubs and other non-suitable buildings and burned them, with rejoicing on Plaza Bolivar. Castro's rule in Venezuela is probably ended.
